**MEMORANDUM**

This Memo is being issued in partial modification of this Department's Memo No. No. 351–Edn (T) dated, the 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2010.

Fee structure committee set up by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal vide resolution No. 826-Edn(T) dated 18/10/2004 recommends for revision of fee structure for various degree level under-graduate Engineering and Technology Courses of self-financing private Engineering and Technology Colleges in the state of West Bengal and the recommendations are *inter alia*:-

- i) Maximum Tuition Fee for the new entrants in Engineering Courses in private self-financing Engineering Colleges from the academic session 2009-10 will be Rs. 55,000/- per annum. No separate development fee will be realized from the students.
- ii) This enhancement of maximum tuition fee is subject to the condition that colleges charging enhanced tuition fee will grant interim relief to the teaching staff as announced by the State Govt. for Govt. aided general degree colleges, enhance pay of the non-teaching employees in accordance with the revised pay scales of non teaching staff in Govt. aided general degree colleges from commencement of academic session 2009-10, until revised pay structure announced by AICTE for teachers in Engineering and Technological Institutions are implemented, if they are not already paying similar or higher pay.
- iii) Besides the aforementioned tuition fee, colleges may charge one-time admission fee of Rs. 4000/- for the entire course at the time of admission, appropriate library fee, refundable caution money, any fee charged by the University for benefit and welfare of the students, and other usual fees charged by the University like registration fee, examination fee etc.

- iv) No capitation fee in any kind or form will be charged by any of the colleges.
- v) Full and half-free studentship and other fee waiver benefits as existing will continue until further review.”

In consideration of the aforesaid recommendation of the fee structure Committee the Governor is pleased to partially modify the memorandum issued earlier vide No. 351-Edn(T) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2010 and the undersigned is directed by order the Governor to say that the existing fee of Rs.41,000/- per annum with one time admission fee of Rs.3000/-, reasonable library fee and refundable caution deposit and other university fees as applicable for the under graduate engineering & technology courses in the private self-financing colleges of the State including Pharmacy will be revised from the academic session 2010-11 in the following manner:-

- i) Maximum Tuition Fee for the new entrants in Engineering Courses in private self-financing Engineering Colleges from the academic session 2010-2011 will be Rs. 55,000/- per annum. No separate development fee will be realized from the students.
- vi) This enhancement of maximum tuition fee is subject to the condition that colleges charging enhanced tuition fee will grant interim relief to the teaching staff as announced by the State Govt. for Govt. aided general degree colleges, enhance pay of the non-teaching employees in accordance with the revised pay scales of non teaching staff in Govt. aided general degree colleges from commencement of academic session 2010-11, until revised pay structure announced by AICTE for teachers in Engineering and Technological Institutions are implemented, if they are not already paying similar or higher pay.
- vii) Besides the aforementioned tuition fee, colleges may charge one-time admission fee of Rs. 4000/- for the entire course at the time of admission, appropriate library fee, refundable caution money, any fee charged by the University for benefit and welfare of the students, and other usual fees charged by the University like registration fee, examination fee etc.
- viii) No capitation fee in any kind or form will be charged by any of the colleges.

- ix) Full and half-free studentship and other fee waiver benefits as existing will continue until further review.

All other aspects of the Memo No. 351-Edn (T) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2010, not modified by this Memo, will continue to apply to various under graduate engineering & technology courses in the private self-financing colleges of the State including Pharmacy colleges.

This will come into effect immediately.
